

WE KNOW EVIL WHEN WE SEE IT




Both Christians and skeptics have to account for evil.

What do skeptics say?.






Skeptics have a bigger problem of evil than Christians.

Maybe this helps




IF WE KNEW WHAT GOD KNOWS, THEN WE WOULD ALLOW WHAT GOD ALLOWS
